



CAMPUS SOIR EXCHANGE STUDENTS [2020-2021]

International exchange students at Université de Nantes will have the opportunity to enroll in French Language support classes at **Institut de Français langue étrangère (i-FLE)** for the 1st semester, 2nd semester or during the entire year.

To benefit from this **free program**, students interested must apply via the **online application** : Under “ French Language Courses”, answer “yes” to the question “ Would you like to benefit from the French support classes?”. Students must also specify the period: 1st semester, 2nd semester or full academic year.

There will be no changes or withdrawals once the application is submitted.

Participating students will receive, at the beginning of each semester, a link for the placement test. Once this test is taken, staff at the Institut of French as a Foreign language – University Language Services (SUL) will notify students of language group levels and the starting date for classes.



Important ! Exchange students enrolled in the DUEF French semester program at i-FLE cannot benefit from the French language support classes. Priority is given to exchange students enrolled in other faculties at the university.

PROGRAM



Classes will take place **twice a week** during **ten weeks** (each semester), usually from **6 pm to 8 pm**. Students will need to take a French Language proficiency test before the beginning of the program in order to be placed in group language **levels** (from A1 to C2).

The objectives of the language support program are defined by the principles of the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEFR) : general and communication skills, task-based learning, language plurality and cultural awareness. Activities will depend on the language levels as well as on the students’ needs.

- ✓ **Beginner:** to present and talk about one’s self, background, likes, dislikes, find one’s bearings, describe and talk about the past.
- ✓ **Intermediate :** describe and talk in the past tense, express one’s preferences, explain choices.
- ✓ **Advanced :** express an opinion, present arguments and defend a point of view.

Students who choose to participate in the support classes will receive an **attendance certificate** at the end of the course with the number of hours taken and a written and oral grade. **Attendance is mandatory**. It is necessary to **take at least 30** out of the 40 hours of classes and **obtain an average passing grade** in written and oral evaluations. If these conditions are not fulfilled, the certificate will not be given.



The French Language level shown in the certificate corresponds to the group level.



Important ! ECTS credits will not be given for these classes.
