Language of Instruction	French is the main language of instruction. Some faculties have courses fully taught in English.
	In order to ensure that students complete their coursework successfully, a minimum of B1 proficiency level in French as defined by the Council of Europe is required in most faculties to study at Nantes Université. Some departments require a B2 level (Letters, History, Geography, Sociology and Philosophy).  Only the Institute of French as a Foreign Language (i-FLE) accepts beginners in their program. Students planning to enroll in other faculties must provide
Language Requirements	<b>proof of proficiency in French</b> : either a certificate by the French department at their home university or an official French language test/certificate (DELF, DALF, TCF or <u>OLS</u> ).
	Since French embassies and consulates are now increasingly demanding proof of proficiency in French, students will need to verify the requirements when applying for their visa.
	Important! For students taking all their courses in English, especially in the Science and Technology, Law and Political Science faculties and at Polytech, a minimum level of B1 in English is required. Proof of French language proficiency is not compulsory, but it is strongly recommended that students have a A2 level in French in order to live well in France on a daily basis.
Academic Offer	Students' faculty of choice will depend on the agreements between their home university and Nantes Université.
	Students are required to take at least 70% of the classes in a Faculty that has signed an agreement with their home university.
	Students will be able to choose classes directly from our Incoming Exchange Students online class catalog.

French Support Classes for Exchange Students	Support classes are offered free of charge for exchange students and take place twice a week during the evening, usually from 6pm to 8pm. However, these classes aren't available for students enrolled in French semester courses at i-FLE.
	French Support classes allow students to receive up to 4 ECTS credits (2 for the oral and 2 for the written proficiency class).
	Students interested in taking French support classes must request them via the Mobility Online application.

# **Accommodation**

Is on-campus housing available for exchange students?	Yes. University housing is available <b>for exchange students only.</b> Students who apply for on-campus housing will benefit from a single furnished room with private bathroom and shared kitchen. The number of rooms being limited, we cannot guarantee to meet all
How do students request on- campus housing?	Students from partner institutions can request on-campus housing via their Mobility Online application. We encourage students to apply early in order to increase their chances of being placed in a residence hall.  For more information about housing in university residences, we invite you to download the Housing information available on our website.

Are residences halls open during semester breaks?	Yes. University residences are open for the entire academic year (September through May) including school breaks. There are no additional housing fees during the breaks.  Students must contact the European and International Affairs office if they need to extend their stay (for academic reasons only) for the summer (June, July, and August).
If university housing is not available, is there any assistance to find private housing?	Yes. For further information students should refer to our website under Accommodation and Housing aid. They can also contact us to receive our International Students guide to find housing.  Additional help will be provided upon arrival in Nantes at the Guichet Unique International students welcome center.

# **Visa and Entry Requirements**

Are exchange students required to obtain a student visa?	Citizens from the European Union, the European Economic Area, Andorra, Monaco, San Marino, Switzerland, and the Vatican are not required to obtain a visa to study in France.  Foreigners residing in any of the previously mentioned territories are allowed to stay a maximum of 90 days in France. However, they must obtain a visa before coming to study in France.  Students who are part of the ERASMUS+ program but are not citizens of one of the above-mentioned entities must obtain a visa.  Citizens from countries that require a VISA to enter France must contact the French consulate or Campus France services in their country of residence at least 3 months before their departure to confirm visa requirements prior to their arrival.  Usually, if a student's mobility period in France lasts more than three months, she/he must obtain a long-term student visa before arrival in France. Are exchange students allowed to work?	The type of visa that students obtain before their arrival in France determines whether or not they are allowed to work. Students who are allowed to work in France must validate their visa or get their student residence permit before starting to work.  Foreign students are only allowed to work 964 hours per year (approximately 20 - 21 hours per week). During academic holidays, they are allowed to work full time.

# Insurances and Health coverage

French Health Coverage / Social Security Sécurité Sociale -CPAM	European Union students must have their European Health Insurance Card upon arrival.  Non-European students must, upon arrival, register for the Social Security and National Health Service Coverage via the following website:  etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr  For further information about health coverage and health services, please visit our website.
Do exchange students need to take out any insurance plans?	Yes, students must purchase a <b>French housing insurance</b> before their arrival, in order to move into their residence hall. <b>Civil liability insurance</b> is also mandatory for all exchange students.  Housing and civil liability insurances can be purchased online. Further information will be provided once the mobility period is confirmed.
Are there any medical services on campus?	Yes. Every student enrolled at Nantes Université has free access to the University's health and social services - SUMPPS. Students must make an appointment in order to see a practitioner.  For more information, visit the <u>University Student Health Services</u> website.
